#### NEWS FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

**The flu season is now in full swing in Maryland.** There have been many cases of it. Sometimes it is hard to tell the difference between the flu and a cold. Besides getting a flu shot (it is not too late), precaution is the way to go with both. The "T Zone", is that area on your face: eyes, nose, and mouth where cold and flu viruses can enter. Please encourage your family to not touch the face, washed hands with soap and water often, drink plenty of fluids, eat healthy, get plenty of rest, and fresh air.

If your child has a **fever**, **actively vomiting** and **actively having diarrhea**, please keep home until fully recovered. We recommend for a fever (over 100 degrees) for your child to stay home 24 hours after no fever without fever medication. In regards to vomiting and diarrhea, keep your child home until able to eat normally again. If you suspect the flu, see or call your doctor for proper diagnosis and medication can be prescribed to lessen the effects.

If your child was **injured**, please notify the health room staff and if your child needs an assistive device, such as crutches, please provide a note from the doctor with activity restrictions. Why, you ask? The physical education teachers need documentation for any activity restrictions and an emergency evacuation plan may need to be written. ## Learning Together Program – Three Year Old Program

The Gorman Crossing Regional Early Childhood Center (RECC) preschool programs are making preparations for classes for the 2019-2020 school year. These classes include children with and without disabilities. The program's focus is helping all children develop communication, literacy, math, problem solving, motor, and social skills. Parents of children who will be 3 years of age by September 1, 2019. Classes meet 10 hours a week (2 ½ hours a day) on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. There are morning and afternoon sessions. The cost is \$180 a month.

Parents may pick up an application packet in the front office at Gorman Crossing Elementary beginning on February 15th. Please note that we are only accepting three year olds this year (Born between 9/2/15-9/1/16).

All applications must be returned by March 29, 2019. A limited number of openings are available for children without disabilities. Children are selected based upon screening information given on the application form and the "Ages and Stages Questionnaire," as well as observations of the child's participation in a playgroup. If necessary, a lottery process is conducted.

Hello FES Community! Pink Shirt Day is coming soon to FES!! Pink Shirt Day is an anti-bullying initiative that began a few years back in Nova Scotia when a boy was bullied for wearing a pink shirt to school. Two other boys who witnessed the bullying organized the first Pink Shirt Day in support of the bullied student. Everyone they knew came to school wearing pink to show that they take a stand against bullying. We will be celebrating Pink Shirt Day by wearing pink on Wednesday, February 27!!

#### February Lessons:

K- The students listened to the story "The Pout-Pout Fish and the Bully-Bully Shark". We discussed what bullying is and what it looks like. We also discussed ways to prevent bullying and what to do if bullying occurs. The students made a pink t-shirt in honor of Pink T-Shirt Day which Fulton will be taking part in on February 27th!

- Students in the first grade learned that post-it notes, chocolate cookies, and the slinky were all created from someone making a mistake. Mistakes can be discoveries! Students then read Beautiful Oops and created their own art masterpieces. We can overcome mistakes by being positive and finding something good that can come from our own mistakes.
- 2- Students read a story called "The Dot." It demonstrates how effort and persistence positively affects learning. Students had the opportunity to make their own dot. This idea promotes a growth mindset which is the belief that hard work will increase potential and intelligence.
- 3- Students read "The Girl Who Never Made Mistakes." This story helps us understand the importance of learning from mistakes and having fun in the process. Students reviewed what a growth mindset entails by making bookmarks that promote having a growth mindset.
- 4- The students listened to the story "The Juice Box Bully". We discussed what bullying is and what it looks like. We also discussed ways to prevent bullying and what to do if bullying occurs. The students made a pink t-shirt in honor of Pink T-Shirt Day which Fulton will be taking part in on February 27th!
- 5- Fifth grade students created skits showing the respectful and responsible thing to do in a given situation with examples and non-examples. The themes were on accepting responsibility, taking ownership of actions, having a growth mindset, and showing kindness.
