

The AHA fundraising envelopes were sent home with students throughout the week. There are extras for those that need more. *Students do NOT need to return the permission slips to participate in our fundraising event.*

If you and your child discuss this fundraiser and want to raise money, please fill out the main envelope form, collect the money (preferably online), and return the envelope to the PE teachers by **Friday**, **April 26**th. It is preferred that money is raised **ONLINE** by visiting heart.org/kidsheartchallenge and join the Fulton Elementary Team! From the Health Room:

LICE HAPPENS!!!! There have been a couple of cases of lice in our school.

Some facts about lice: they do not fly or jump, but only crawl, they only attach the eggs (nits) to the hair shaft of clean hair, it spreads by head-to-head contact and sharing of combs, brushes, hair ornaments, hats, etc. What can you do to either prevent or catch it before there is infestation? Regularly check the heads of your children at least on a monthly basis. The first Friday of the month might be a good time and after any sleepovers. REMINDER: season is changing to warmer weather. Make sure your child has seasonal appropriate clothing to change into and kept in the classroom or backpack. Why, would you say because your child would not need change of clothes. However, unexpected soiling of clothes occurs, such as mud, liquid food items, blood, and bathroom issues. The school does not have clothing for children to change into and you will be called to bring in a change of clothes. Spring allergies have started. Does your child suffer from spring allergies? There are some things you can do to help your child during the spring. Regularly give allergy medication as prescribed by the doctor. When your child comes in from outdoors, the following may help: wash hands with soap and water, wash off face, including glasses, with a wash cloth, wipe down from head to toe with the wet cloth, and change clothing, if not going back outside. Try not to allow your child to go into the bedroom with the clothing worn outside; this will prevent the pollen to fall on the bed.
