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School Safety at Fulton Elementary School

Dear Fulton Community,

Dr. Martirano held a community forum on school safety and mental health issues. His message reaffirmed the necessity for our security measures to be followed without exception. We encourage you to reference HCPSS resources by visiting:

We want to share with you the procedures we follow when visitors come to Fulton Elementary and actions we have taken.

Visitor Procedures

1. The front door is the \mathbf{ONLY} entrance point for all visitors.

2. Please ring the buzzer. You will be visible on the security camera.

3. Be prepared to state your name, your child's name and the reason for your visit.

4. All visitors will enter directly into the front office and must present a valid photo ID and sign in on the Lobbyguard kiosk.

5. A visitor's sticker will be printed for visitors following the above procedures.

6. Any visitor at Fulton Elementary without a sticker will be escorted to the front office by a staff member.

7. All visitors must have their visitor sticker visible at all times while in the building.

8. Do not allow other visitors to "piggyback" into the building when you visit. If they do come in behind you, help us by insisting that they go to the front office.

9. When you are in the building, do not open the door for other visitors, even if you know them.

Action Steps

Administration has met with all staff and reviewed these safety procedures, as well as reinforcing the following: 1. No doors should be propped open at any time.

2. Any visitors without a badge should be stopped and

escorted to the front office.

3. Increased vigilance during arrival, dismissal and recess,

4. If any staff or community member sees something that may raise a question, they are to call the office immediately.

Please feel free to contact us should you have any questions. In consideration of our staff and students, we thank you for following these procedures for the safety of our entire school community.

Police Patrols at HCPSS Schools

In response to recent events, Howard County police officers are being asked to conduct at least one foot patrol a day at a school (K-12 private and public schools) in their beat. Not every school will receive a visit every day, but Fulton will be visited regularly. Officers are to check in and meet with the school principal/assistant principal upon arrival and walk the interior of the school for familiarization of the school and staff. HCPSS is encouraging officers to try to coordinate their checks at pick up and dismissal if possible and invite officers to have lunch in the cafeteria.
