Bus Safety Message

As a reminder, it is very important that our students adhere to the following safety practices each morning and afternoon. These safety practices are in place to keep bus riders safe.

- 1. Make sure that you arrive at your school bus stop at least 5 minutes before the scheduled pick-up time.
- 2. Never run toward or around a school bus at a bus stop or on school grounds.
- 3. Never retrieve items that fall under the bus or near the bus wheels.
- 4. Make sure that vehicles on the roadway are completely stopped before entering or crossing the roadway.
- 5. Never cross behind a school bus, always cross in front of the bus after the driver has signaled to you to cross.
- 6. Follow your bus driver's directions; they are there to make sure that you're safe.

In order to volunteer in the school or chaperone field trips you must complete the training required by the Howard County Public School System. There are 2 PowerPoint presentations that you must view. After viewing you will need to print out and complete certificates for each presentation.

Once the training certificates are completed and signed, they should be returned to your child's homeroom teacher. These certificates are kept on file throughout the school year and must be competed each new school year. Teachers must BOTH certificates on file to allow parents, guardians or other family members to volunteer in any capacity.
