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Celebrating Who We Are Through Cultural Show & Tell

Building relationships, authentically knowing our students and where they are from or know what is important to them, helps us to better reach them. The Cultural Show & Tell is a way to ensure that our students feel connected to the school. One of the most wonderful aspects about Fulton Elementary School is our rich diversity. It is essential that every student feels that they belong at Fulton Elementary School and understands that their culture is valued. We want to celebrate each student in our school community!

Merriam-Webster defines culture as:

Falcon's Eye

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a: the *integrated* pattern of human knowledge, belief, and behavior that depends upon the capacity for learning and transmitting knowledge to succeeding generations

b : the customary beliefs, social forms, and material traits of a racial, religious, or social group; also : the characteristic features of everyday existence (such as diversions or a way of life) shared by people in a place or time popular culture Southern culture

c: the set of shared attitudes, values, goals, and practices that characterizes an institution or organization a corporate culture focused on the bottom line

d : the set of values, <u>conventions</u>, or social practices associated with a particular field, activity, or societal characteristic studying the effect of computers on print culture

This year all students will take part in sharing an item, photograph, memorabilia, etc. about their **<u>cultural</u>** background, traditions, interests or celebrations with their classmates. This activity will give the students a chance to gain a better understanding of their classmates, appreciate each other's interests along with similarities and differences. This activity will help to build classroom community.

Some examples that students may share are:

If you are a family that loves football like my family, you can share this during your assigned time as part of your culture. I would share that every Sunday my family gets together to watch football, we love to wear our spirit wear all day long. We gather around the TV and we always eat nachos during half time. This is part of my culture and it is a special time that my family shares together.

Another example that I would share is that I was born and raised in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. It is customary that we eat french fries and coleslaw on ham sandwiches. My son loves pizza and he eats pizza at least once a week. This is part of our culture. Families that have lived in Maryland may love to pick and eat crabs. All of these foods may be part of our culture.

Finally, if you are a family that loves soccer and it plays a big role in your life, soccer may be part of your culture. If you are on a soccer team, then you are part of a group and this is part of your culture. This might be something that you share on your assigned Show & Tell day.

The students will participate in this sharing a few minutes a week and it will be done during community/classroom meetings or social studies content time. This activity is aligned to our social studies curriculum and our language arts/reading curriculum and standards. Essentially, students are sharing about themselves and what is important to them. **Note**: Please do not send in food, delicate or breakable items. If your child would like to share these items, please send in a photograph of the item or a recipe for the food.

This school wide activity is a way for each teacher to build a classroom community in which each person is valued for who they are, and it enables us to teach our students that we need to value similarities and differences. We need to accept one another for our thoughts, opinions and beliefs as they may be different. We are not all the same and it is important to lift up, celebrate and learn about each other.

From the PE Dept:

Parents/Guardians, please remember that tennis shoes are required for all students in K - 5th grade for Physical Education (PE) class. Children should not wear sandals, flip-flops, crocs, boots or backless shoes (including backless sneakers) to PE class because of the safety concern. Also, please remember that your child should wear clothes appropriate for movement. Wearing skirts, dresses, baggy clothes or loose jewelry can be dangerous and uncomfortable. To avoid your child sitting out from PE class, it may be a good idea to pack extra shoes and shorts or pants on PE days. Thank you for your understanding that learning in a safe environment is our top priority.

In case of student injury or illness, parents/guardians will need to adhere to the following physical education guidelines to ensure your child's health and safety:

- 1. Write a note indicating the reason your child needs to be excused from the physical activity portion of PE class for 1-3 consecutive days (i.e. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday).
- 2. Provide a physician's note for more than 3 consecutive days.
- 3. Provide a physician's note when returning from a long-term illness or injury.

Influenza, also known as the flu, is a serious illness that affects people of all ages. One of the best ways to prevent the flu is through vaccinations. We are pleased to again join with the Maryland Partnership for Prevention (MPP) to offer flu vaccinations at our school.

New this year, you may give permission for your child to be vaccinated using (1) an online form at www.vaccineconsent.com or (2) the hard copy form attached to this message.

We urge you to protect your family from the flu. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone ages 6 months and older get a flu shot. Please visit

www.cdc.gov/flu/index.htm for more information about the flu vaccine.

The clinic at our school will be held on [10/4/17]. We will send a notice home the day he/she has been vaccinated.

If you want your child to be vaccinated, please:

1. Fill out every section of the attached Consent Form **OR** complete it online at

www.vaccineconsent.com. If you fill out the paper consent, write neatly and use ink. Only

fill out the hard copy consent or the online consent. Do NOT fill out both.

2. Use your insurance card to fill out your insurance information accurately. Your insurance company will be billed. There is no co-pay or deductible. You will NOT be charged by us or your insurance company.

3. Read the Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) and talk to your health care provider or the school nurse about any questions you have.

4. Return the consent form no later than **September 27, 2017**.
